Tomorrow someone will be in the office between 8 and 10:30AM if you need to speak with someone in person. We will announce future times on our Facebook page until we get power back. If you are not following our Facebook page, now is the time to do so as we are going to be announcing updates regularly about USCIS and court closures.

As of right now it is not known when the New Orleans Immigration Court and the New Orleans USCIS and Asylum offices will be able to reopen. If you have court, and interview, or biometrics appointment in the next week you should not attend as it will be closed and potentially dangerous to go.

We are going to be contacting each of our clients individually to let them know what they need to do for their respective court dates or appointments. We cannot take phone calls due to the power being out, but we are monitoring all messages and texts and responding as they come in.
